Changes to Masses in the Parish of Our Lady, Mother of the Church, Castleknock

Because the number of active priests in Our Lady Mother of the Church parish has gone from three, to what is effectively, one and a half, and following a meeting of their Parish Pastoral Council, the number of Masses in **Castleknock Parish** has been reduced.

On weekdays there will be one Mass per day: **10am on Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday; 7.30pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays.** In keeping the Tuesday and Thursday evening Mass, it was considered important to continue to offer some celebrations of the Eucharist at times for those who cannot attend morning Mass. For the Lord’s Day, the number of Masses will be reduced from five to three: **a Saturday Vigil Mass at 6pm and two on Sunday morning.**

At present, Masses at 10am and 12 noon are being considered. The change in weekday Masses comes into effect from **Monday 4th October.** Because of restricted numbers attending due to COVID, **the new schedule of Sunday Masses will take place only after 22nd October,** from which time, please God, we will be able to welcome full congregations again.
