First Sunday of LENT - 9th March 2025

Last Wednesday we were invited to start on our Lenten journey which culminates on Easter Sunday. Lent calls us to change our ways and begin a fuller living out of the gospel.

First Reading: (Deut.26:4-10): Through the ceremony of offering the first fruits, the Israelites recognised all that God had done for them in the past especially during the Exodus. **Second Reading**: (Rom.10:8-13): The core of our Christian belief is that Jesus is risen. Anyone who says that and believes is already saved. **Gospel**: (Lk.4:1-13): Jesus was tempted like we are but did not sin. Through his grace we can resist temptation and overcome sin.

<u>REFLECTION</u>: Repentance of itself is not enough, grace must also be available. But if grace is offered and not accepted, then nothing comes of that either. There is no point in putting up a sail if there is no wind. There is no point in planting a seed if the ground is frozen. It is not enough to cut into people's hearts in order to save them. They must be touched by grace. Lord touch our hearts with your grace so that we may produce the fruits of repentance.
